Over the years I have become enamored with the definition of Church. Its roots are in the Greek work *ekklēsia*, which translated literally means to “call out.” As believers, we are called out to hear the individual instructions, prepare to fulfill our part and then go out to accomplish them. That’s Church. It is NOT worship or the building in which we worship. Church doesn’t even happen on this campus. Church happens when we leave here to accomplish the tasks given to us by Jesus. How then to be authentic Church? Fasten your seatbelts for an exciting discovery with me!!

I know we have never done it that way before and change is uncomfortable, but for the sake of being authentic Church we are going to give it a try and evaluate at the conclusion. I see us doing together the things we already do individually. With strength in numbers, just imagine our Christian influence and impact on kids, adults, grandparents and community as we interact side by side to show Christ's love in real time. And I know this is not for every single person. It is my prayer that most will benefit from the challenge. Come, join me on this adventure!!

To bracket this exceptional experiment in July, single-theme Bible studies in multi-generational settings help lay the ground work for “being Church.” We have chosen five parables to sharpen our intergenerational interaction: The Prodigal Son, The Good Samaritan, The Rich Farmer, The Lost Sheep, and The Sower and the Seed. What could a grandparent learn from a teenaged confirmand? Or visa versa? What could a new parent learn from a seasoned parent? What could we all learn from each other as we all study and react to the same lessons on the last three Sundays in June and the first two in August, thus bracketing our grand July Church challenge. I invite you to be part of this unique (for Hope) way of studying Scripture and exercising the faith of table mates. You will hear a lot more about this in the weeks to come! Come, enjoy the ride!!




