By reviewing and highlighting the six chief articles of the Christian faith, we see the Christian life-skills and basic Christian doctrine at work. But Luther's Small Catechism takes a back seat to the main thrust of the Reformation–justification by faith and not by works! We rejoice not so much in Luther himself but in his emphasis on this pivotal affirmation: God does the justifying, i.e. making us perfect through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and we gain this perfection by believing what he says. It is all his doing! Thank God!

wo upcoming events highlight the nation of Israel. The first is at 7:00 p.m. on 31 August. Come experience the land of Jesus through a PowerPoint presentation of our 2017 tour. There will be Pastor Ralph commentary and tourist comments by those who explored this covenant land. The second opportunity to experience Israel yourself begins with a presentation by Collette, our tour company, on 13 September at 7:00 in Room 104. At this gathering you get a preview of the 10 days abroad, you get to ask questions and you get to sign up for our 18-28 April tour next year. If you have Israel on your bucket list, this is the event that can start to make it a reality. See you at both!

t the conclusion of our intergenerational Bible study, which I believe was very well received, we will finish our two year walk through the Today's Light course. After completion, we explore the first 300 years of the Church leading up to Constantine's declaration of legitimacy for the followers of Christ. How did the Church grow from the 3,000 converts of Pentecost Day to the recognition of the Roman Empire? Why is this foray into history important? I believe that the lesson we can learn from the infant Church will be apropos in years ahead as the Church is muscled out of the mainstream of the culture around us and becomes the voice of the counterculture we have always been called to be. Dr. Paul Maier, noted Lutheran historian, will be leading the way of discovery. Come, join me in the journey.

STUDY SERIES GROUP



 Sunday School provides a structure for teaching God's Word. A systematic teaching of the Scriptures need to occur through all age levels. Children, youth, and adults need opportunities for discovery, review, and interaction as they study God's principles.

2. Sunday School mobilizes and trains laity for leadership.



- It's difficult to say who benefits more, the teacher or the student. The teacher's Bible knowledge and care grows. . .his or her life is changed. . .a stretching occurs as leadership skills are developed. Students learn and are challenged, but how much more is that true in the life of the teacher.
- 3. The Sunday School is discipleship! Every shepherd/teacher must have a desire to see each student in his/ her flock have a spiritual life change. Since discipleship is "teaching to obey all I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:20), it's not merely teaching facts, but teaching obedience. While there are many styles of discipleship (one-on-one, small groups, etc.), Sunday School is the group discipleship that is entry -level. It's the "next step" after attending morning worship. From Sunday Schools can develop small cell groups — discipleship. Since many people who attend church are not in a one-on-one or small group discipleship, an effective Sunday School is a form of "Discipleship 101."
- 4. Sunday School organizes the church into caring groups. The teacher becomes a shepherd for the class, an extension of the pastor's ministry. Where the pastor finds it impossible to know all the needs of the congregation, Sunday School teachers know when someone is absent or hurting and can express love personally.
- 5. Sunday School leads the church in prayer and relationships. From the preschool class through all the adult classes, prayer is directed toward the specific needs of the class members. Often the class not only prays, but has the opportunity to respond to specific needs. Fellowship and informal conversations flow easily in small groups where care is expressed and people know your name and your needs.

Our third through fifth grade students are invited to SWAT, beginning September 13th. We'll meet each Wednesday night from 6:30 p.m. — 7:30 p.m. in the Great Room.

SWAT is a great time for our students to develop and practice attitudes of service to others, study the Word of God in different ways, and get to know and develop friendships with each other outside of church. Friends are always welcome.


