

PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS



St. Valentine is associated with February as any lover can tell you. Love, with its highs and lows, can flummox the best of us. If you think otherwise, recall your own adolescence and the ups and downs! The Church year also gives us a taste of the highs and lows during this time of year. We will stand with Peter, James and John at Jesus' transfiguration and will hear the voice of God. Just as quickly, we will follow Jesus into the desert to be tempted forty days by Satan at the beginning of Lent. There seems to be a disconnect between the Mount of Transfiguration and the hill of Calvary. And, yet, they are both necessary for the salvation of mankind...The Son of God sacrificed on a cross for me! During the forty days of Lent, which begin on Ash Wednesday, 14 February, Valentines Day, take some quiet time to reflect on the enormity of God's love and sacrifice for us prompted by his unconditional mercy.

The forty days of Lent, fashioned after Jesus forty days of desert temptation or forty hours in the tomb call for quiet introspection and confession leading to cleansing and production. We are sinners, estranged from our heavenly Father and always by nature at odds with his will. We cannot remove that condition on our own! It takes an act of God to do so. Of course, these forty days lead us directly to the place where God acted on our behalf—Calvary and the cross. Jesus took our place and our punishment for estrangement from the Life-giver. Thanks be to God for his love for us. Reflect, repent, renew, rejoice!

Stewardship of God creation calls for an ongoing effort to keep the Father first in our lives and the gifts he gives second. So often we get that backwards. We focus on the "stuff" and forget the Giver. When ones priorities are aligned, stewardship becomes much easier. It's all God's and we get to manage it for a few years. In the New Testament, Jesus speaks of money and possessions only second to the message of the Kingdom of God. It is that important. What do we hear? Be cheerful givers. Give the first fruits. Give a percentage. The love of money (not the money itself or its management, by the way) is the root of all evil. Listen to the parables: the pearl of great price, the wicked tenants, the ten talents, the unforgiving debtor, or the shrewd steward...all dealing with money or possessions. As this new year begins to unwind, the bottom line of our Spending Plan is not 100%, I invite you to join me in following the scriptural guidelines for stewardship. I invite you to join me in tithing, in first fruits giving, in joyful giving. Let's manage it all for the glory of God and expand his kingdom with our dollars!

Family Promise, a do-unto-the-least-of-these ministry, continues to be an outreach opportunity for Hope. In so doing, a recap of where Family Promise of Clear Creek has journeyed this past year would in order. We have been a part of housing and feeding 15 families over the year. That breaks down to 19 adults and 37 children who have been served by 16 host congregations and 960 volunteers. Of course, the goal of Family Promise is to have these families come out of the program self-sufficient. What a great ministry of this congregation. You are always welcomed to become part of this effort.

EVERY ONE HIS WITNESS

We talk a lot about spreading God's Word – about telling others about the hope that is in you. But how does that actually happen? Many of us shy away from talking about Jesus because we don't feel we're qualified or have the skills needed. You have an opportunity to learn how to naturally and genuinely share the Gospel with your friends and neighbors who have not heard the Good News. "Every One His Witness" is a relational, contextual witnessing approach to evangelism. After this workshop, you will be a more effective witness of Jesus in your everyday life!

STEPHEN MINISTRY

Sometimes people ask me, "Does Stephen Ministry really work?" And my answer is always, "Yes!" But it doesn't work like magic, or by pulling a lever or flipping a switch. It works because a caring Christian comes alongside a fellow, broken human being and cares for them in the Name of Jesus Christ. The care giver (Stephen Minister) listens as a care receiver pours out their heart – their worries, fears, guilt, shame. He or she then shares with their care receiver words about the mercy of God, the love of God, and what Jesus has already done for them. The care giver prays for and with the care receiver - that God's hand of healing be upon them. We know that God works on His own time schedule and in His own way. So the caring relationship has no time limit. That relationship continues as long as the one in crisis needs it. Stephen Ministry works because it is one-on-one, confidential care from care giver to care receiver.

So many people have found healing and hope through Stephen Ministry. If you think you need help, let me know.






Youth Ministry

I never knew I could love something so ferociously, so deeply or so profoundly until they placed that tiny bundle in my arms for the first time. Nine months of pregnancy- the ultrasound, the fluttering kicks, had not prepared me for the rush of protectiveness, adoration or hope. A women's Bible study during those months though, had prepared me for God's expectations of my life as a mother. I had been studying the book of Matthew that year and Mary and I connected intimately on the concept that while we hold them, love them, nurture them—they remain, ultimately, His. Our most important task is to teach them about our Savior and to hand them over to His service. How do we know if we are succeeding? Author Richard Ross offers this insightful list of ten factors to intentionally strive towards in our teens lives:

- Teen who shares a warm heart connection with a parent who is transparent about his adoration of God's Son, embraces the Word and lives for the glory of God.
- Teen who shares a life-on-life relationship with a disciple who adores Jesus and guides them through a discipleship process.
- Teen who shares heart connections with many members of the congregation and mutual adoptions with one or more adults who adore Jesus
- Teen who actively serves with ministers, other generations and their peers
- Teen who actively participates in intergenerational worship on Sunday mornings
- Teen who knows how to correctly interpret Scripture, to pray and takes responsibility for continued growth
- Teen confident about having conversations that are evangelistic or call for reasoned defense of faith
- Teen who knows how to apply the principles of Scripture to life
- Teen who approaches vocation and all of life with a sense of divine calling
- Teen connected to significant adult to welcome and work together on doubts and questions.

A Valentine “Heart Attack”

I've seen this idea on Facebook several times, and I may have even shared it once or twice. What's great about the “heart attack” is that there are so many ways to make it work for your family. Start by cutting out hearts in different colors, and sizes. You'll need 14 hearts per person, or if you want to do the family as a whole, you'll only need 14 hearts. Each day, beginning February 1st, you'll choose a heart and write something you love about your child on that heart. Then, tape the heart to your child's door. By February 14th, they'll have a door full of reasons that you think they are special. Another option is to think about the things you love, enjoy about family time. Maybe each night at dinner, think of something about your family that you each love, write that on a heart, and hang it in a space everyone will see it each day.

OR, build the bonds between siblings and help them make a heart for each other each day.

OR, extend the challenge. Could you and your spouse come up with 14 different reasons you love each other?

OR, start collecting hearts and mail them to grandparents as a special Valentine greeting. What are 14 different ways that your extended family impacts your family in a positive way?

When a bulb needs planting, out comes the trowel. . .when a screw is loose, the screwdriver is called for. . .when a pipe is rusted, a wrench is very handy. Tools are important parts of everyday life. But, when not needed, not often thought of.

Stephen Ministers also have tools that are most handy and useful. They are there when needed. What is in the tool belt?

- Compassion — True caring about another person
- Dignity — Serious response
- Listening — Intently hearing before replaying
- Empathy — Relating to the situation
- Sharing — Offering life experiences with understanding
- Privacy — Respect for one’s feelings
- Confidentiality — Assurance of trust
- Understanding — No judgment of issues

With God give resources, training and commitment, Stephen Ministers are ready to share time and listen closely with God’s guidance.

Two tools you might use are Trust and Request. These begin the process.
