

PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS



The Feast of the Resurrection is the culmination of the "three days" of Good Friday, Holy Saturday and, finally, Easter Day. There are two days of darkness and quiet before the third day. When the darkness from the sixth to the ninth hour (12 noon to 3p.m.) on Good Friday ended with the exclamation, "It is finished," darkness seemed invincible, irrevocable. BUT our heavenly Father had a different plan with a much different outcome. Just as a seed falls into the darkness of the earth before it erupts as something brand new, so the body of the Son of God was laid in a borrowed tomb awaiting the most glorious words for human, sinful ears: "He is not here. He is risen!" Christ Jesus, the Light of the world, is not dead but living, the firstfruits of those who fall asleep in faith. The Feast of the Resurrection shines second to none. The light that breaks forth in this death defying moment of life awakens in us the hope and assurance to shine ourselves, reflecting the living Lord Jesus. The darkness of our rebellion which necessitated the cross, a life-giving sacrifice, has been driven back by the wonder of light and life in a resurrected Jesus! The Lord is risen and so shall we. Rejoice and be glad! The night has ended. The day has come. He is Risen! Alleluia!

Any curious individual asks questions about the resurrection, e.g. will we be the same age in the resurrection as when we died? What about those lost at sea? Will I know my history? Maybe a few comments about the resurrection would be in order. First of all, resurrection is not resuscitation. We are not this body come back to life again. We are made new (cf. St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 15:35ff and his analogy of the seed, which I used in the preceding paragraph...the whole chapter is pretty good) and fit for eternity. The "how" of this will be determined and engineered by the God who created it all in the first place. The primary relationship will be with Jesus, the one who makes our resurrection possible by his own. But there remain many unanswered questions. Maybe we need to leave the fruit of knowledge on the tree and let our God be God with our future, trusting him to get it right!

Hope Lutheran continues its search for a replacement for Stephanie Poyner as Director of Music. I solicit your prayers for this process. Stephanie was a asset who developed a fine program of musicians from this congregation to support and augment worship on a regular basis, a strength of Hope Lutheran. We are being diligent in the search for a talented musician to lead the program again.

Youth Ministry



Knock, Knock

EXACTLY....

Okay—it might not be that bad, but sometimes the schedule gets so crowded, the exhaustion reaches a peak and Jesus finds Himself at the bottom of our priority list and I don't know about you, but when I don't keep Him first, everything else falls apart. My strongest balance, my clarity of vision, my sense of peace and contentment, even in the chaos, begins with time in His Word and among His people. As parents we need this foundation to lay the foundation for our children. Richard Ross, in his book, "Youth Ministry That Lasts," outlines the following characteristics of teens who carry their faith into their adult years:

- Spiritually alive parents: spiritually lethargic parents = spiritually lethargic or absent young adults. Teens need parents who love the church and live their lives on mission for Christ, who are modeling a faith life that continues to learn and grow.
- A heart connection with their congregation: multiple connections with multiple age groups. Hope strives to connect teens with their peers through age level ministries and for decades teens traditionally help with events like VBS that give them a mentoring role with younger children but we also are taking new strides toward helping teens develop relationships with older generations through our summer and Advent generational Bible studies and summer congregational service projects. These are excellent opportunities to connect in new ways. Our career panels in Bible study have also been an introduction to adults who may share like interests. Ross says, "Teens with little love for the bride (the church) eventually wander away from the groom (Christ)."
- Bible drenched age group ministry: we have recently taken a hard look at what and how we study in our Sunday and weekday ministries and developed a four year outline to clarify and hold accountable the journey from Confirmation to high school graduation. We strive to mix old school Bible lessons and current events for a holistic approach to this brief window on their faith journey.

ROSE to life again to offer everlasting hope to all Christians. Just when it would seem that death has won, the cocoon splits and out comes the butterfly full of life!

Imagine the powerful memory your family can make on Ascension Sunday (May 13th) when you all go outside and release the butterflies. What a beautiful picture of Christ triumphing over the grave!

Columbarium Committee Update

Columbarium Background:

A Columbarium is an arrangement of niches into which an urn or urns containing the cremated remains of a deceased loved one is placed for permanent inurnment. The cremated remains of the body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they came. Reverent disposition of the cremated remains in accordance to the Lutheran Church means remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or Columbarium. The Hope Lutheran Columbarium niches are designed to hold two vase or box style urns, so up to two people can be inurned in a single niche.

Construction:

Construction of the Hope Lutheran Columbarium is continuing. The location between the CFD and Sanctuary has been raised to get it above the 500 year flood plain. The foundation has been completed and the paver walkway, pad, and stone benches have been installed. The landscaping, final grading, installation of sod, and modification of the irrigation system should be completed in March. The contract has been let for fabrication of the Columbarium and it is expected to be delivered and installed in June.

Construction Sale Continuing:


Thank you again to those members who have already purchased niches – this has allowed us to proceed with construction. Until construction is completed the sale of the niches at the pre-construction price of \$ 3,000 per niche will continue. The Columbarium Committee has decided to offer an initial operation price of \$ 3,500 per niche from July 1 through December 31, 2018, at which time the price will increase to \$ 4,000 per niche.


Transformation
