What is Faith Builders?

The short answer is that Faith Builders is a partnership between Hope Lutheran Church and parents to help you grow your child's faith. Faith Builders was designed in an effort to help parents be more confident in their role as the primary faith nurturers of their children. The plan was for Hope to provide resources, knowledge and support to assist parents in fulfilling the promises they made at their child's baptism.

In addition to helping parents build faith in their homes, the hope was also to encourage relationships with families of similar aged children here at Hope Lutheran. Our Faith Builders events were developed in an effort to provide relationship building time, as well as an opportunity for parents to be presented with information about the particular developmental stage of their child. Each

Faith Builders event is closed with a short worship service and the parental blessing of their children.

In the past couple of years, we have started to change the way some of our Faith Builders events are structured. We have incorporated the second grade Bible presentation and the high school graduation Faith Builders events into our worship services. This fall, we are rethinking our Faith Builder events for parents of preschool aged children and kindergarteners.

Our efforts continue to focus on the best ways we can help enable parents in their faith walk with their children, but we are working to improve the relationship building piece of that equation. A relationship with families who have similar aged children is important, but so are relationships throughout age levels in our congregation. I read a blog post late this summer that still sticks in the back of my mind. I shared it on the Children of Hope Lutheran Facebook page when I posted about the presentation of Bibles to our second graders, and I am going to share the link below, because I believe it is an important read for *all* our members.

In addition to some changes in our Faith Builders program, we have encouraged intergenerational Bible studies the last couple of summers, and offered opportunity for fellowship and service during the month of July. There is a purpose to the changes we are trying to make. There is a vision we are striving toward, and this blog post is an excellent explanation of the reasoning behind our efforts.

"There is one verse that we often use to demonstrate the mandate in Scripture for parents/caregivers to disciple their kids: Deuteronomy 6:7 – Impress these commandments on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. I love this verse because it shows the most everyday, most ordinary moments and tells us in those very ordinary times to talk about our extraordinary God.

But often in shining the spotlight on this verse and directing our focus of discipleship exclusively to parents/caregivers, we miss something of great importance, something that changes everything about the command.

This command wasn't given to parents. It was given to the community of faith."


At 4:00 p.m. our costumed friends will begin to arrive. We will start off in the Sanctuary with spirited songs and a fun-filled message.
