hese forty days of resurrection celebration, contrasted with the forty days of Lenten penitence and preparation, bring the abundant life of a follower of the Resurrected Christ into focus. Sin, death and the devil stand powerless in the face of Jesus. No wonder we celebrate! But these "in between" days (in between Easter and Pentecost) challenge each of us to build on the resurrection. Since we will be raised as Christ was raised, we pursue the mission of Jesus with reckless abandon. . .what can stop us?! Far too many of us we hear the words that he is not here but risen and fail to translate them into the foundation of our new life. Take the blessing of these forty days of Easter to not only reconnect with life but live it.

he Ascension, an oft overlooked festival of the Church — it always falls on a Thursday, seals the deal for Jesus and you and me. He ascends to the right hand of the Father, the place of honor and power, and there intercedes for us. The Mediator Jesus continues his work on our behalf today. He constantly attests that his blood has cleansed us, that we are his brothers and sisters, and we are precious in his sight. Yes, the Ascension is a great day to celebrate.

he Day of Pentecost (a week of weeks counted and then a day of celebration) for the Jews of the first century focused attention on the birthday of the giving of the Torah, i.e., God establishing a covenant with his people at Sinai. Historically the celebration of Pentecost, fifty days after Passover, focused on the grain, especially wheat, harvest. These two emphases set the stage for the Christian Pentecost. It is a day of ingathering (3,000 converts that day) and the covenant of Calvary put into action. God the Holy Spirit enlivens the disciples to proclaim Jesus, crucified and resurrected, as the only means of salvation, the only name given under heaven whereby we might be saved. We have taken the Jewish feast and refashioned it into the birthday of the Church and the new covenant in Jesus' blood. What a great backdrop for our confirmands and their affirmation of faith. Come, celebrate the inspiration of the Spirit that brings us to Jesus.

peaking of the Church, let me share a little about the Texas District of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. We are in partnership with almost 400 congregations which support nearly 140 missionaries. Since 2004 we have had 99 new church starts (averages 5.5 weeks between starts!). Half of these mission starts worship in a language other than English and these missions have added some 9,000 additional weekly worshipers. God the Holy Spirit continues his pentecost work today in the Texas District. As Vice President of Area D, I am privileged to ordain and install a number of pastors. It is not unusual for the Lord's Prayer, said in unison and in native tongue during those services, to sound much like Pentecost Day.

COFIRMATION

Later this month, our Confirmands will conclude their three-year studies of the Scriptures and Christian doctrine. On Saturday, May 23rd we will celebrate FaithBuilders VI. That evening, the parents of our Confirmation Candidates will have the opportunity to bless their child and present him or her to the Church saying, "My child is prepared to be confirmed in the Faith." Then, our candidates will publicly confess, in their own words, the Faith we all share in Jesus Christ. The candidates are working hard on their statements and we look forward to hearing them. The next day — May 24th — we will celebration Confirmation Sunday during the Festival of Pentecost. At our 11:00 a.m. services, the candidates will publicly confess the Faith and will declare their intent to continue in the Faith — affirming their baptism. And after that?...their journey of faith in the Faith continues! Please continue to pray for and encourage all our young people in the Confirmation program as they study and prepare to confess the Faith — the Faith into which we have been baptized.

How are your conversations going? Have you talked with anyone before or after worship that you don't know? People are coming to visit Hope. So keep on developing conversations and relationships with someone new who has come seeking the wisdom and knowledge of God. Help them find the wisdom and knowledge of God in the foolishness of the cross of Jesus Christ and in the exclamation from the empty tomb, "Christ is Risen!"

Treasurer's Report Fiscal Year 2015

Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 closed with a gain of \$2.067. Receipts were \$990,615 and expenses were \$988,548. This year saw improvement over last, in that we did not face low summer receipts. As always, we operate on a cash basis, and our current financial state is reviewed when planning future spending.

The Building Fund began FY 2015 with an outstand debt of \$1,691,563. Because of your contributions and investments, we were able to make additional principal payments of \$162,990. The outstanding debt at the close of FY 2015 is \$1,471,465.
