I love October! The weather is in the sweet spot. It isn't so hot anymore. It's not too cold yet. The long summer is over and we can get outdoors without sweating buckets or passing out from dehydration. I also love October because of two great holidays: Halloween (it's just a lot of fun for our family), and Reformation Day. On Reformation Day, we celebrate the work of Dr. Martin Luther — the theologian and reformer. On October 31, 1517, Luther questioned the Roman Catholic practice of indulgences (purchasing forgiveness of sins with money) when he nailed his 95 theses to the Castle Church at Wittenberg. In his study of the Bible, Luther rediscovered the good news of the Gospel that was forgotten in Medieval Church of Rome: the fact that we are declared righteous by the grace of God through faith in Jesus Christ and not through our own effort.

Luther called the Church to return to the Scriptures — return to the Word of God as the sole source and norm for faith and life. On this 498th anniversary of the Reformation, we pause to thank God for Luther and the Reformation that began with his actions. How do we celebrate? Be reformed by the Scriptures. Get back into the Word of God. Look to Jesus Christ for your salvation. The good news? It's already a done deal accomplished on the cross and out of the tomb. You are free! Go in peace.
