Pastor's

he Concept of Time fascinates most of us. It speeds. It drags. It evaporates before our eyes. Nevertheless, we are bound by it (until the resurrection!). Examining how the Greek New Testament interacts with time has always intrigued me because it uses two different words to define time: *chronos* (κρονος): static, second-by-second, sterile time and *kairos* (καιρος): dynamic, meaningful, supreme, and remembered time. The distinction is important for followers of the new born King. Our lives are lived in both "times" but the second brings significant change and resolve because of the importance of the moment. A Savior has been born and the world changed in that moment. We are called to be changed as well. The month of January, named for Janus-the two faced Roman god-brings significant time for resolution. Looking back we remember and learn. Looking forward we resolve and change. May each of us use this time of reflection to introduce life changing, Christ-following decisions.

he "Gentile Christmas," better known as The Epiphany, brings down the curtain on our Christmas celebration. It's the Twelfth Day, celebrated every January 6th. The Epiphany directs each of us to the message of the angels at the Nativity. This good news of the birth of the Savior is joy for all the world! The magi (read: Babylonian astrologers) are not Jewish, but have traveled to greet the King. They found Jesus and offered him princely gifts before returning another way. I wonder if they later discovered the true identity of the Child they discovered. We know! The Babe of Bethlehem grows to be the crucified, resurrected and ascended Lord to be introduced to all the world. [By the way, the Greek Orthodox faith, The Eastern Catholic Church, celebrates Christmas on 6 January. The root of this difference with the Western Catholic Church is grounded in the switch from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar, a twelve day difference, hence the twelve days of Christmas. There's that *chronos vs. kairos* time again.] We will celebrate The Epiphany for the next number of weeks, focusing on the revelation of Jesus as the King, the very Son of God. Listen carefully to the revelations about Jesus.

Which is to be for all mankind. Our daily deeds and words reflect this good news so that other might see and hear and join us in the Body of Christ. If we are not different, there will be no difference! The proclamation of the angel and shepherds has been passed on to each of us and the urgency of both is ours as well. Join me in the call to be different!

From my family to yours, a blessed and prosperous New Year!

The season of Epiphany is a time when the Church celebrates the revelation of God — when God revealed himself by becoming one of us — the long-promised Christ — Jesus of Nazareth — true God and true man. And Jesus revealed the love and mercy of God offered to all people through his death and resurrection on the cross for the sins of the whole world. And the Christ has been revealed to you as well in His Word and Sacrament. Because God has revealed himself to you through Jesus Christ, by the Holy Spirit you are now being equipped to be one who reveals Jesus to others. You are God's instrument as you reflect the love of God in Jesus Christ in your words and in your actions. May others who do not yet know Him, have the Christ revealed to them through you!
