NOTES FROM PASTOR JON

I have noticed a trend over the last few years — and you may have as well: fewer people in worship on Sunday morning. It hasn't been a dramatic change; just a slow decrease each year. And we are not alone. Most other congregations — both LCMS and of other denominations — are seeing this same trend. So why is it happening? That's the milliondollar question. Some possibilities are:

- "Regular" worship attendance is being re-defined. Attending once every couple of weeks or once a month is now considered "regular."
- 2. Sunday morning is no longer sacred. Sports, community events, shopping all are happening on Sunday morning.
- 3. Time. People run themselves ragged and are over-booked Monday thru Saturday.


- Sunday is their only "down-time" or "family-time."
- 4. Technology. I don't have to physically attend worship. I can listen to a sermon online or watch a church service on TV.
- 5. Worship is boring. I can be "entertained" in so many other ways.

What do you think?

So what is the solution? That also is a million-dollar question. But I think so often we forget what happens in worship. In the Divine Service, the Almighty God comes to us. He is actually present with us. Jesus is with us. He comes to us through the Word read and proclaimed. He comes to us through the Sacraments — baptism and the Lord's Prayer. He is present wherever two or three are gathered in His name. And Jesus is present among us in the love we share for one another — the prayer

we offer for one another, the encouragement and support we give to one another. Just our physical presence and fellowship together is God working among us. This is all incredible, mind-blowing stuff!

But none of that happens for you unless YOU, yes YOU are physically present in the gathered Bod of Christ on the Lord's Day -Sunday. It may not look like it or seem like it, but your brothers and sisters in Christ need you. Because that's how the Body of Christ works. 



Countdowns can be a great visual reminder for children, and a Valentine countdown can be a fun opportunity to remind your children of God's great love for each of us.

Write Bible verses on construction paper hearts. Display the hearts where you family will see them, and choose one verse each day to look up and discuss. Or, hide one heart in your home each day and let the children go on a hunt to find the heart. Once found, look up the verse, read, and discuss.

Ten references and explanations are listed below. Can you find 4 more together to create the 14 day countdown from February 1st—14th?

- 1. Romans 8:39—Absolutely nothing will ever be able to separate us from God's love.
- 2. John 3:16—God loves us so much that He sent Jesus to die for us. That is a huge sacrifice to make.
- 3. 1 John 3:1—Our God is an almighty God who is in complete control of the world. Not only does He love us but he wants to lavish His love on us and He wants to make us His children.
- 4. 1 John 3:16—He loves us so much that He was willing to give up His life for us even though He was completely sinless.
- 5. Romans 4:8—He loved us so much that He died for us before we were even His children. He loved us before we were His children as much as He does now.
- 6. Ephesians 5:1-2—Jesus loved us and we are to try to be like Him in the way we love others.
- 7. Jeremiah 31:3—God loves us with an everlasting love.
- 8. Psalm 36:5—God's love is very big. There is nowhere in the world that it does not reach.
- 9. Psalm 89:2—God's love will stand firm forever and He will never ever let us down.
- 10. Romans 8:28—God will take care of those who love Him and everything will work out for the good of His purpose.



Ladies Guild is open for every woman of Hope and all are encouraged to come and attend a gather, meet us in person, see what services are available for each gifted believer.




The Simply Giving Program

Columbarium Committee

Background

The 1960 census of Friendswood stated that there were 960 people. Today, there are 40,000 people and Friendswood has become

"HOME" to a large contingency of people. There are limited places available for a final resting place for those who may desire to remain in this area in perpetuity.

The Friends Church Cemetery is restricted to members of the faith or to people who lived in Friendswood prior to 1960. In 2015 the Episcopal Church installed a Columbarium (a place to permanently store cremated remains) on their property for their members.

The traditional church cemetery had, for centuries, served as the ideal place of burial for its congregational members. Members were born in the church and spent their lives involved in the church community. After death, members remained a part of that community by interment (ground burial).

The 20th century trend has been to choose a secular cemetery and this trend has caused a lack of church cemeteries. Additional reasons for the lack of church cemeteries on church properties has been lack of space, being land locked and large cost for additional property for a cemetery.

The LCMS has no official position on cremation. Cremation is increasing in favor, in part because of space limitations in some cemeteries, and because of health considerations. The primary reason for the increase in cremations is economic, however, since it avoids such costs as purchase of coffins and cemetery plots and substantially lowers the expense of a funeral.

In their textbook Pastoral Theology (used at our Synod's seminaries), LCMS Pastor Norert H. Mueller and George Kraus offer this perspective: "Not too long ago, the church viewed cremation negatively. Because the general public associated the practice with heathen religions and/or an attempt to disprove the possibility of the resurrection, Christians were reluctant to consider it. In itself, the practice has no theological significance and may be used in good conscience." Synod's Lutheran Service Book Agenda, approved by the LCMS in convention, includes instruction (rubric) for the committal of a person's ashes, encouraging burial or interment and discouraging the scattering of the ashes. 
Committee

Committee members include Harold Benson, Margie Riley, Katherine Kohn and Bruce Hunter. The committee is considering a number of items associated with installation of a Columbarium including:


- •Legal/regulatory requirements

- Potential locations
- •Construction/maintenance cost
- •Policies and procedures
- •Other church installations

Currently the Committee is planning to present information and recommendations to the Board of Directors in February and to the congregation at the annual Voters' Assembly on March 19, 2017.


