



PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS

There is no doubt in my mind that we are pilgrims trekking through a foreign land to our Father's land! We have a forty day journey in Lent to prepare for crucifixion and the open tomb. The overarching, guiding principle for the pilgrim on his Lenten journey requires the emptying self to provide an emptiness for Jesus to fill, i.e. the more one focuses on self, the less opportunity to focus on Jesus! This is very much the attitude of John the Baptist: "I must decrease so that he may increase." The disciplines of lent, i.e. repentance, reflection, abstinence, or penance all point the pilgrim to Christ's suffering and cross as the result of his life lived in self-centeredness and rebellion against the rule of God. It is good that we have these forty days to take the pilgrim's journey, to set aside those things that cling to us and to which we cling, to become small that Christ might loom ever larger for us, becoming all in all for us, consuming us into himself. In order to better strive for this decrease of self, we are given the disciplines of lent to direct and aid us. We control our appetite. We quiet our mind. We renew our hope. And, we anticipate the celebration of the cross and resurrection! I invite you to continue to journey with me through these forty days of Lent.

The events of Holy Week complete our Lenten pilgrimage to a place of Crucifixion and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus. St. Augustine called Holy Week the Great Week because of the great things that were accomplished during these seven days. By the powerful and dramatic liturgy of the Great Week, Christians share in these events...the messianic entry into Jerusalem to the shouts of hosanna to the son of David, his combative teaching in the Temple, his celebration of his final Passover and institution of the Holy Eucharist, his mock trial and brutal scourging, his abandoned death and burial all leading us to reflect on our part, our sin. Thanks be to God who deals with us in his mercy and not his justice...we would be doomed if he did. I invite you to continue your Lenten journey to Holy Week and then to the open tomb!

The Feast of the Resurrection turns the world and its understanding of really living upside down! And why not?! He who was crucified and dead is now alive. Why would we look for the living among the dead? Christ is Risen! He is risen, indeed! Our time of solemn preparation during our Lenten journey will be completed, and now we regularly rejoice with our living Lord. For you see, the Feast of the Resurrection is not just a single event. The resurrection is an continuing reality. In face, the resurrection is celebrated by the Church every Sunday morning as we gather for worship on the Lord's Day (the day of resurrection), as we stare death in the face and not flinch, as we spend ourselves on others--knowing that we will not run out of life to give away (it's everlasting living connected to the Life Giver!). Can there be any wonder why a relationship with a living Lord changes you and me and, by our Spirit-inspired witness, the world? I so anticipate celebrating this Feast Day with you and of sampling a taste of eternity with Christ. He is risen! Alleluia!

Later this month we will hear, in my opinion, the greatest words in all of Scriptures, *“Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said”* (Matthew 28:5-6) These are cosmos-changing words. For Christ has come to redeem the whole of creation and has accomplished His mission in His death and resurrection. At the same time, they are also life changing, life-creating words for sinners such as you and me. Because Christ is risen, you too will one day rise from the dead as He did. In fact, you have already been raised from the dead in your baptism — where and when you died with Christ and have been raised to new life with him. (Romans 6) And daily, you now die to sin and rise to new life as a new creation in Christ.

I encourage you to once again participate in the worship services and gathering opportunities at Hope during Holy Week: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, the Feast of the Resurrection. You can find a schedule of all these events and more in this newsletter. All of them will point to, and culminate in the hearing of those three incredible words of Good News: *“Christ is Risen!”* You will be blessed by coming and participating at these worship services. And you will be a blessing to others by being there alongside them. Invite a friend or neighbor to come with you!
