What is Hopefest at Hope Lutheran Church?

Are you new to Hope? Hopefest is several events that culminate with the BIG weekend on October 7-8, 2017. This is a time for all the congregation (no matter which service you attend) to get together for fun, food and fellowship and to open our campus to the community as an outreach activity.

Our community recipients this year are:

- **Point of Light** Sponsored by Christus St. John Hospital, a clinic that provides health care for everyone including assistance for uninsured and under-insured. They offer a wide range of family health services including family practice, primary care, and acute care with a volunteer staff of physicians, nurses and physicians assistants. The clinic provides for people of Dickinson and the surrounding communities.
- **Christian Helping Hands** Provides services to the needy in the Friendswood-Pearland-Manvel area. Services include food, utility bills, emergency rent, clothing, and medical services. CHH has assisted over 140,000 people in the service area. It is an all volunteer organization with funding from churches, community organizations and private donations.
- **Forgotten Angels** This organization provides specially designed homes and facilities, as well as recreational, educational and vocational opportunities for more than 100 individuals with special needs. Founded by a Pearland business owner, this organization has been in operation since 2001.
- Adult Reading Center Located in Pearland, this organization's mission is to transform lives through education. They provide a nurturing environment that improves reading, writing and basic communication skills. Since its launch in 1987, the Center has achieved steady, managed growth with over 200 volunteers assisting adult learners each year.

These organizations will receive a portion of what we raise during HopeFest weekend. Some money we raise also stays here at Hope for various needs in the congregation.

The BIG weekend will begin on Saturday, October 7th with a Craft Fair, Tea Room, Bake Sale, Shrimp Boil and Live Auction. Followed on Sunday, October 8th with a traditional service at 8:00 a.m. and a casual service at 10:00 a.m. At 11:00 a.m. we will begin serving BBQ, free Children's Games, Craft Fair & Bake Sale, Silent Auction, Bingo and hours of fellowship.
