

PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS



We have a forty day journey in Lent to prepare for Calvary and the open tomb. The guiding principle for the pilgrim on his Lenten journey is that of emptying self to provide a place for Jesus to fill, i.e. the more one is full of self, the less room for Jesus! This is very much the attitude of John the Baptizer: "I must decrease so that he may increase." The disciplines of Lent, i.e., repentance, reflection, abstinence, or penance point the pilgrim to Christ's suffering and cross as the result of his life lived in rebellion and self-centeredness. Personally, for my sin Christ died. How beneficial that we have these forty days to take the pilgrim's journey, to set aside those things that cling to us and to which we cling, to become small that Christ might loom ever larger for us. In order to better strive for this decrease of self, we are given the disciplines of Lent to aid us. We control our appetite. We quiet our mind. We renew our hope. And, we anticipate the celebration of the cross and resurrection! The journey with me into Lent.

Suggestion: If you are not in the habit of daily immersion in the Word, choose one of the Gospels and read a chapter each day. When complete, chose another and repeat.

The senseless loss of young lives has splashed across our screens again. This time in Broward County Florida. What an horrific display of unbridled evil. As columnist Peggy Noonan of the Wall Street Journal asserted: It is in the air we breathe! The talking heads have posited solutions ranging from emphasis on gun control to mental health to non-existing families to cultural rot. There are salient points in most of these but what I am not hearing from "the experts" is the downward spiral of a society without a solid foundation and relationship with its Creator and Redeemer. The further God is pushed out of our daily activity as a nation, the more sinful human nature takes the wheel. The results are always disastrous. Just read the headlines, or better yet, read the Scriptures which document the course of human nature. I am not advocating nostalgia for the 50s but a return to walking the way outlined by our Father who knows the end of things. He has watched us over the millennia destroy what he intended and knows the way out. Left unchecked, we will no doubt continue to rot. Knowing that our wants and thoughts are subservient to his will, not ours, rights the ship and changes the direction. That change, brother and sisters, begins with you and me as the catalysts. It starts with a daily renewed relationship with our merciful and gracious Father in our baptism, daily witness based on the Word, regular and steady attendance in Word and Sacrament on Sunday morning, engaging the market place with our Christian presence, serving our neighbor selflessly and acknowledging we are not in charge. We exist as creatures of the Creator. What better time than Lent to repent (*literally: turn back!*)!

Easter arrives early in 2018. At the end of March we will once again engage the drama of Holy Week: triumphant entry, teaching, Last Supper, betrayal, trial and crucifixion, burial and, wait for it..., resurrection!! We begin the week of 25 March with Palm/Passion Sunday. These events in the life of Jesus are just what we are now preparing for during these forty days.

CONFIRMATION:

Our annual Confirmation Retreat takes place March 2-4. All of our students and their instructors will spend the weekend at Camp Lone Star outside of LaGrange, TX for a weekend of study, worship, challenge, and fun. This year's theme is: "The Journey." Please pray for our Confirmation students as they prepare to publicly confess the faith we all share in Jesus Christ and take responsibility for their continued growth in the Faith.

WITNESS:

Our first Every One His Witness workshop was held last month. Honestly, I was hoping to get two, maybe four people to participate. And 19 signed up! Thank you so much to all of those who signed up and participated. A comment from a workshop participant:

"Every day we go into the marketplace working on something that is a challenge with people who are not always doing God's will. And at the end of the day, the work isn't meaningful. (In the workshop) you learn to execute The Great Commission, for someone you love but is broken and has no source of hope in their life...It's incredible and learning some methods is so important."

The workshop doesn't give you a script, a couple of Bible verses, and then send you door-to-door. The goal is to instill in you a witness mindset and then give you a methodology - framework to guide your process of witnessing to unchurched and de-churched people you already know. Think of all the people you know at work, at school, on your team, in your neighborhood, or even in your own family who don't know of the love God has for them through His Son Jesus Christ! You can be a witness to them. We plan to have more workshops in the future in order to begin to equip more of you to be Christ's witnesses in the world.

The patrol cars in the high school parking lots will return to their regular numbers though somewhere, in the background of our consciousness, there will continue a static buzz of awareness that safety remains a concern. I won't wax political on gun control or get on my soap box over the sad state of mental health care options—there are already plenty of people not listening on either side of those fences. The critical thing for each of us walking the daily routine is listening—just listening. As parents of teens it can be frustrating—there often seems nothing to listen to, only grunts, mhms and sighs but persistence is important and being available when they are ready (even though it's not your ideal time) can be critical. Clinical psychologist, Dr. Ruth Peters shares, "Getting your kids to confide in you is tricky business, but if you are sensitive and patient, they'll learn to trust your heart and your judgement." Tap into the resources on your school campus and within your faith family to create a support network around your kids. Perhaps too, you'll find along your path, someone with no one to listen and maybe you can pause and open your heart to that one too—how might we change the world with a few more pauses?

What is Lent?

How do we explain the idea and meaning of Lent to the children around us? There are soup suppers at the church on Wednesday nights, the color on the altar is purple, and sometimes people give up special foods or things for Lent, but why?


Lent is the time to help us prepare for the joy of Easter that comes because Christ rose from the dead. We take time to think about why Jesus had to die on the cross for us, and we remember that Jesus loves us SO MUCH that He was willing to do just that – die on that cross to save us from our sins.

Soup suppers on Wednesday nights are a wonderful fellowship opportunity before our special Lenten services. The paraments are purple as a sign that we are sorry for our sins and also for royalty – that we should bow penitently before the King. Giving up food or special things during Lent is a personal choice. If giving something up helps someone feel closer to the Lord, or helps him or her better understand Christ's suffering, then that is a private choice for that person.

During Lent, take time to talk with your children about Christ's suffering and why it had to be, remembering to emphasize that because of that suffering, we are forgiven, and that on Easter, Jesus rose and is alive. Perhaps seek out a Lenten devotional to share as a family, or come to the soup suppers and Wednesday night services. Help your children understand and appreciate this season of the church, and your Easter celebration may be more joyful than ever this year.

Columbarium Committee Update

Columbarium Background:

A Columbarium is an arrangement of niches into which an urn or urns containing the cremated remains of a deceased loved one is placed for permanent inurnment. The cremated remains of the body should be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they came. Reverent disposition of the cremated remains in accordance to the Lutheran Church means remains should be buried in a grave or entombed in a mausoleum or Columbarium. The Hope Lutheran Columbarium niches are designed to hold two vase or box style urns, so up to two people can be inurned in a single niche.

Construction:

Construction of the Hope Lutheran Columbarium is continuing. The location between the CFD and Sanctuary has been raised to get it above the 500 year flood plain. The foundation has been completed and the paver walkway, pad, and stone benches have been installed. The landscaping, final grading, installation of sod, and modification of the irrigation system should be completed in March. The contract has been let for fabrication of the Columbarium and it is expected to be delivered and installed in June.

Construction Sale Continuing:

Thank you again to those members who have already purchased niches – this has allowed us to proceed with construction. Until construction is completed the sale of the niches at the pre-construction price of \$ 3,000 per niche will continue. The Columbarium Committee has decided to offer an initial operation price of \$ 3,500 per niche from July 1 through December 31, 2018, at which time the price will increase to \$ 4,000 per niche.
