

PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS



These forty days of resurrection celebration, contrasted with the forty days of lenten penitence and preparation, bring the abundant life of a follower of the Resurrected Christ into focus. Sin, death and the devil stand powerless in the face of Jesus and his resurrection. No wonder we rejoice in his saving actions! But these days in between Easter and Pentecost challenge each of us to build on the resurrection. Since we will be raised as Christ was raised we can pursue the mission of and witness to Jesus with reckless abandon...what can stop us?! Our foes have been defeated! For too many of us we hear the words "he is not here. He is risen!" and fail to translate this truth into the foundation for our new life. Take the blessing of these forty days of Easter to not only reconnect with life but also to start spending forward the life everlasting.

The Ascension, an oft overlooked festival of the Church because it always falls on a Thursday, completes the incarnation of Jesus. He ascends to the right hand of the Father, the place of honor and power, and there intercedes for us. The Mediator Jesus continues his work on our behalf every day. He constantly attests that his blood has cleansed us, that we are his brothers and sisters, and we are precious in his sight. Yes, the Ascension is a great day to celebrate.

Because you have asked...**Discover Greece: In the Footsteps of Paul the Apostle** tour begins 20 March 2019 for ten days. For those who have visited Israel, this tour will fill out the rest of the New Testament, even the Island of Patmos where St. John wrote the Book of Revelation. The Day of Pentecost (*think: a week of weeks and then a day of celebration*) for the Jews of the first century focused attention on the giving of the Torah, i.e. God establishing a covenant with his people at Sinai. Historically the celebration of Pentecost, fifty days after Passover, focused on the grain, specifically wheat, harvest. These two emphases set the stage for the Christian Pentecost. It is a day of ingathering (3,000 converts that day) and the covenant of Calvary, not Sinai, put into action. God the Holy Spirit enlivens the disciples to proclaim Jesus, crucified and resurrected, as the only means of salvation, the only name given under heaven whereby man must be saved. We have taken the Jewish feast and repurposed it into the birthday of the Church and the new covenant in Jesus blood. What a great backdrop of our confirmands and their affirmation of faith. Come, celebrate the inspiration of the Spirit that brings us to Jesus.



Notes from Pastor Jon

On Easter Day, we like to proclaim to one another, “Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!” And usually that might continue for another week or so. And then we’re back to the same routine. But Christ isn’t risen just during the Season of Easter. Christ is risen and has been in a risen state since the third day after his death on a cross almost 2000 years ago. Death no longer has a hold of Him. “Christ is risen!” is the Gospel proclamation in three words. “Christ is risen!” is your only hope. Because He is risen, you too will rise. Sin, death, and decay will one day no longer have any hold on you. And because God has said so through His Son, the resurrected life is as good as already yours. “Christ is risen!” isn’t just about Easter. It’s every day and forever. And the good news is that you and I have the joy of living that glorious and gracious fact every day!

CONFIRMATION: Later this month, our Confirmands will conclude their three-year study of the Scriptures and Christian doctrine. On Saturday, May 19th we will celebrate Faith Builders VI. That evening, the parents of our Confirmation Candidates will have the opportunity to bless their child and present him or her to the Church saying, “My child is prepared to be confirmed in the Faith.” Then, our candidates will publicly confess, in their own words, the faith we all share in Jesus Christ. The candidates are working hard on their statements and we look forward to hearing them. The next day – May 20th - we will celebrate Confirmation Sunday during the Festival of Pentecost. At our 11:00 service, the candidates will publicly confess the Faith and will declare their intent to continue in the Faith – affirming their baptism. But then what? What happens next? Their journey of faith that began at Baptism continues!

Please continue to pray for and encourage all our young people in the Confirmation program as they study and prepare to confess the Faith - the Faith into which we have been baptized.

COMMUNITY GARDEN: Earlier in April I had the opportunity to take the Pre-K 4's of our Tiny Treasures Preschool through the garden and teach them about from where and how we get some of our food. The students then had the opportunity to add to the garden by planting some flowers. It was a fun time as we learned together about just some of the many and diverse kinds of plant life God has given us from His marvelous creation.

How are your conversations going? Have you talked with anyone before or after worship that you don’t know? People are coming to visit Hope. So keep on developing conversations and relationships with someone new who has come seeking the wisdom and knowledge of God. Help them find the wisdom and knowledge of God in the foolishness of the cross of Jesus Christ and in the exclamation we now enjoy, “Christ is Risen!”

There's a flurry of excitement in the month of May—summer is so close! There are plans for graduations, confirmations and vacations and in the middle of all that promise, author Gene Veith plops this depressing statistic on my desk, "The studies found that the LCMS retains about one out of every three confirmands, which is about the same rate as in other churches." The finding came from not one, but two, recent research projects on the retention of young people. Not so shocking—"this age group can best be reached by means of 'relationships.'" My older daughter has searched most of her freshman year to find a church while she is away at college. She tried some of the campus ministries and some others nearby but the place she has settled is a tiny church made up of mostly senior citizens—there's no "youth group" there, no dinner for students on Sunday nights. She missed services last week and will again this week since she's back at home. "I hate missing too many Sundays there," she shared, "I know they worry when I don't come." How does she know? She hears about it on her return, they talk to her and voice their joy that she is back among them. Relationships. It's not about the programs, the music, the sermon—it's about relationships. Throughout their young lives I've pushed my kids into relationships in their faith family whether it's learning to properly be introduced and shake hands with an elder or helping clean up after a church event or moving outside their comfort zone in the intergenerational Bible studies—I've intentionally connected them and prayed over those relationships. Who are you connecting your kids to? And who can you see that needs a connection with you? Need some help? Let me know, I'm happy to make the introductions, find you a seat at the Bible study and pray over your relationships!
