t. Paul states in the 13th Chapter of his letter to the Church in Corinth that in the present age we see through a glass darkly. We might say that as we look at our life. It's almost as though we are looking into one of those carnival midway mirrors...it gets pretty distorted for many of us. In light of our own myopic self perception, the wonder of the Incarnation of the Son of God among and for us increases. We seldom see beyond ourselves and yet into this self-centered world Jesus is born, taking on our flesh and our lot. We stand in awe and amazement that the Son of God would empty himself in order to connect to his creatures in a way God had not done before. Of course we celebrate such a Gift at the Nativity of our Lord, at Christmas. We celebrate the Christ Mass! It would be this Jesus, who matured into a messianic proclaimer of the Kingdom of God and how it worked, who would walk straight to the cross for each of us, declaring that this is what Son of God, and consequently you and me, looks like. "Come, follow me!"

December 2018 HYMN OF THE MONTH Savior of the Nations, Come

Text: Latin original by Ambrose of Milan (4th century) German translation by Martin Luther (1554)

English translation by F. S. Janzow (1991)

Tune: NUN KOMM DER HEIDEN HEILAND or VENI REDEMPTOR GENTIUM; Martin Luther, simplified from Gregorian chant

Ambrose was born in Germany and educated in Rome. He became a lawyer in Milan and distinguished himself as a debater of theology. The Arian heresy at that time had a misunderstanding of the two natures of Jesus. Ambrose was so good at debating the Arian heretics that he was elected bishop of Milan in 374 A.D., though he had not yet even been baptized. He is also known for helping to convert Augustine, another great theologian.

Ambrose was skilled in setting great theological truths to music. He wrote many hymns. Many were in a particular meter that came to be known as Ambrosian Meter. His "style" of hymns came to be called "Ambrosian" hymns. I don't think this had anything to do with that dessert often served at potlucks. If you look at the text to this hymn you will see it explains some things about the two natures of Jesus, who was both God and Man.

Luther simplified the chant melody of this hymn and then translated it into German. His translation is the model for our English version.

This hymn will be sung on the First Sunday in Advent. It is the quintessential Lutheran Advent hymn, although some other denominations include it in their hymnbooks also. Lutheran composers, from Bach and onward, often base cantatas, choral music and organ compositions on this tune.

How the Grinch Stole Christmas!

For the past several years in the month of December, I change my Facebook cover photo to a version of this quote from the 1966 Dr. Seuss TV Movie How the Grinch Stole Christmas!: "He puzzled and puzzled till his puzzler was sore. Then the Grinch thought of something he hadn't before. Maybe Christmas, he thought... doesn't come from a store. Maybe Christmas, perhaps... means a little bit more!"

If you look simply at the title of the movie, it doesn't sound like it will have a very happy ending. I would imagine, however, that almost all of you are familiar with the TV Christmas time classic, and you know that in the end, the Grinch learns the true meaning of Christmas. All the efforts of the Grinch to steal the presents, candy canes, Christmas stockings, Christmas trees, and even the food for the Christmas feast do not keep the Whos from being joyous on Christmas day. Even though they wake up to find all the perceived necessities of Christmas to be gone, the Whos manage to find joy and "welcome Christmas" by simply being together.

If the Grinch were to come to your home to steal your Christmas, what would he perceive as the most important parts needed to make Christmas happen? Do those parts consume and overwhelm your Christmas season? Without realizing it, we are easily pulled in by the commercialism of Christmas. I think that's why I like the quote above so much and repost it every year. That quote reminds me to slow down, breathe, and remember what Christmas is truly about. The quote reminds me to focus on the gift of baby Jesus, and not the 1,001 gifts, decorations, and just right party foods that mailers and TV ads insist we need.

Is it possible to start our Christmas season in the place where the Grinch movie ends, with Christmas meaning more than the gifts and decorations and parties and food? Can we start in Advent and simply prepare our hearts for Christ's birth? What would that look like? What would we need to let go of to simplify this potentially stress filled time of year?

As we begin the Advent season, take a minute or two to think about how you would simplify your holiday season. Where can you begin to let go of the expectations?

The Grinch expected the Whos to be sad and cancel Christmas because he stole all their presents... Narrator: "But this... this sound wasn't sad. Why... this sound sounded glad. Every Who down in Whoville, the tall and the small, was singing, without *any* presents at all! He hadn't stopped Christmas from coming, it *came*! Somehow or other... it came just the same."

Grinch: "How could it be so? It came without ribbons!... it came without tags!... it came without packages, boxes, or bags!"

Christmas will come as it does every year. Will you be ready with a joy filled heart?


